

OHIO ABSENTEE VOTING LAWS HAVE CHANGED

WHAT CHANGED?

Absentee / mail-in ballots must now be received by 7:30pm on Election Day to be counted. **There is no grace period.**

REQUEST YOUR BALLOT EARLIER.

Call your county Board of Elections, visit their website, or visit VoteOhio.gov to get an absentee ballot request form.

RETURN YOUR BALLOT EARLIER.

Mail your ballot to arrive before Election Day. Allow plenty of time! Even if your ballot is postmarked before Election Day, it must arrive on or before Election Day to count.

You can also deliver your absentee / mail-in ballot to the dropbox outside your Board of Elections. Or visit VoteOhio.gov for a list of people who can return your ballot for you.

OR VOTE IN PERSON

If you prefer to vote in person, you can vote early at your county Board of Elections. And you can always vote in person on Election Day. (Note that if you request an absentee ballot but then decide to vote in person, you may be asked to vote a provisional ballot.)

When it comes to voting by mail, early is the new ON TIME.
